Building a Foundation for Hope

Knock Foundation was created in 2008 by five individuals with a shared vision: to build a grassroots organization that initiates and actively affects positive change in the developing world. Knock is a 501(c)(3) public charity registered in the United States and is also an international NGO. Knock fully supports the operating budget for the Matumaini Child Care Center. Matumaini, meaning 'Hope' in Swahili, is more than an orphanage it also encompasses a community outreach program and plans to extend that with the completion of the new center. Part of the center will be utilized as a community center in that the classrooms and dining hall will potentially be home to educational seminars on a variety of topics as the opportunity arises as well as vocational training to the community.

Knock Foundation is dedicated to creating opportunities for underserved populations in the developing world. By working closely with the affected communities, Knock develops comprehensive, self-sustaining and holistic practices designed to alleviate poverty and its attendant problems. Our work stems from an abiding belief that to reach one's full potential, every human being must have the opportunity to pursue an education, practice healthy living and exist in a clean environment. Knock partners with the communities served to develop and sustain these objectives, offering hope, friendship and a better tomorrow to as many people as possible.

Knock's current largest project is building a new center for Matumaini. The current Matumaini orphanage located in Rau Tanzania is home to 20 children, ages 7-15. The children currently live in a very small 3-roomed building without electricity or water and not enough space. We purchased a 1 acre piece of land in Rau in February 2009 and will be building a center which will include dormitories to accommodate up to 60 children, a dining hall, and 2 classrooms. Phase 2 will include an administration block as well as a house for volunteers. Please join our efforts to make this happen for the community in the Kilimanjaro Region of Tanzania.
